## Branch Pick-up Begins May 6th

Bundled branches will be picked up SIX TIMES in 2019, beginning the FIRST MONDAY of MAY and continuing through October, starting on the first Monday of each month. If Monday is a holiday, then we start the next day.

The start dates and the rules are listed to the right. You may want to save this list so you can time your trimming to our pick-up dates.

Have your **tied up bundles** at curbside or roadside by 6:30 a.m. on those Monday mornings. Our crew is on a rotating street schedule and it may take them 3 to 5 days to complete the branch collection. They will visit each area and street only once.

Branches must be tied up in bundles. We will leave a "red tag" explanation if we don't pick up your branches.

**START DATES** MAY 6 JUNE 3 JULY 1 **AUGUST 5 SEPTEMBER 3 (Tuesday) OCTOBER 7** FOLLOW THESE RULES: Branches cut to 4 feet <u>\_\_\_\_</u> Branch diameter 4 in. or less Bundles must be tied with 11/2 twine or string (no wire or plastic) Bundles up to 25 lbs. only



Our program is intended to help homeowners with the disposal of tree and shrub branches that do not qualify as yard waste. If it fits in a yard waste bag it should not be in the roadside bundle for us. Our collection service is not meant to remove whole trees. Please make other arrangements for removal when a tree is cut down.

<u>Please don't put your branch bundles in the</u> <u>street</u>. Place them in the parkway closest to the curb or the edge of the road. Also, we may not be able to pick them up if a parked car is in the way.

This township service is offered only to residences along the roads that we maintain in unincorporated Lisle Township. Please call if you are unsure if we service your road.

### Sidewalk Squares Replacement Program



#### **ONE-TIME INCENTIVE PROGRAM Deposit Deadline - Friday, August 2**<sup>nd</sup>

For years Lisle Township Road District has picked up 50% of the cost to help homeowners replace cracked, raised or sunken sidewalks. We are pleased to announce this Fall, in order to incentivize residents to replace dangerous sidewalks, a cost of \$1.25 per sq. ft. (instead of \$2.50 per sq. ft.,) which is \$31.25 for the typical 5' by 5' section. You will not find this savings anywhere. You need to call <u>and</u> mail your deposit to our office by August 2nd to be eligible.

Contact us at 630-964-0057 or <u>highway@lisletownship.com</u> with your name, address and phone number prior to Aug. 2nd. (EARLIER NOTIFICATION THE BET-TER!) Place a dab of paint on the square(s) you want replaced. Our superintendent will come out to measure late summer and give you an agreement form to sign. Return the form with half of your portion's payment cost. When the job is completed

and the area restored (by us), we will bill you the balance. If the replacement is extensive, you may ask for a payment plan to spread the cost over time.

Children in your subdivision will be walking to the new Lisle grade school opening this Fall. Please take advantage of this opportunity to replace your broken and potentially dangerous sidewalks.



### **Road Maintenance Scheduled for 2019**

The township roads being resurfaced this season are listed below. Approximately 2 inches of surface is removed and replaced with new asphalt.

Project start dates have not yet been determined.

FLYERS will be distributed to the homes along these streets about 5 days before construction begins. They will explain the repair process and outline any driving and parking restrictions.

We apply surface treatments to preserve and restore other township roads.

**Reclamite** is a sealant used on one year old roads and is reapplied every 4 years. About 16 of our roads are on this schedule.

Crack-filling seals cracks too big

for the other products to repair. Contractors clean out the cracks then fill them.

Our reclamite contractor will seal one side of the street at a time, so at least one lane is open for resident traffic. The sealants need up to four hours of drying time before the lane is opened.

RESIDENTS living on streets where this work will be done will be notified by flyer before the work starts.

OUR goal is to provide safe, durable and attractive roads and right-of-ways, while minimizing inconvenience to residents.



### Letter from Commissioner Ed Young to Township Residents



Another tiresome winter season has come to an end. Icy, very cold and long is the best description. The Road District used more salt this winter season than anybody can remember and for some unknown reason our plows damaged more mailboxes this season than any other. But now we look forward to pleasant weather and a busy schedule of road maintenance, storm sewer projects and tree trimming and removal.

We have a long backlog of tree trimming and removal projects. Our tree stock is showing its age and many of our trees have disease, fungal or insect infestation which weakens the tree and often times require the tree to be removed. Our list

for tree removal is constantly being adjusted to address those which pose a safety hazard; consequently your removal may be pushed further down the list. Don't hesitate to call us if you have any concerns about the tree removal process or notice a safety concern.

As you may be aware Naperville Township has placed a binding referendum on the April 2019 ballot to have the Naperville Township take over the duties of their Road District. What effect this referendum will have on the consolidation of the Lisle and Naperville Townships Road Districts, approved by both Townships electorate in 2017, is unknown. Consolidating the Road Districts would save money for the taxpayers of the consolidated district.

Finally, I would like to thank our great crew for the fantastic job they did this snow removal season. There were days where the crew was called out three times making for some very tired drivers. They were able to keep our roads safe for travel without any accidents. A big thank you to our Lisle Township Road District's drivers!!!

#### SUMP PUMP DISCHARGE

Let's help keep our neighborhood safe! As a reminder, the DuPage County Ordinance (8-128.1) requires your sump pump be discharged onto grassed areas of sufficient length to allow dissipation before discharge exit site, a <u>minimum</u> of ten feet (10') from any property
