Branch Pick-up Begins May 7th

Bundled branches will be picked up **SIX TIMES** in 2018, beginning the **FIRST MONDAY** of **MAY** and continuing through **October**, starting on the first Monday of each month. If Monday is a holiday, then we start the next day.

The start dates and the rules are listed to the right. You may want to save this list so you can time your trimming to our pick-up dates.

Have your **tied up bundles** at curbside or roadside by 6:30 a.m. on those Monday mornings. Our crew is on a rotating street schedule and it may take them 3 to 5 days to complete the branch collection. They will visit each area and street only once.

Branches must be tied up in bundles. We will leave a "red tag" explanation if we don't pick up your branches.

FOLLOW THESE RULES:

-  Branches cut to 4 feet
-  Branch diameter 4 in. or less
-  Bundles must be tied with twine or string (no wire or plastic)
-  Bundles up to 25 lbs. only




Our program is intended to help homeowners with the disposal of tree and shrub branches that do not qualify as yard waste. If it fits in a yard waste bag it should not be in the roadside bundle for us. Our collection service is not meant to remove whole trees. Please make other arrangements for removal when a tree is cut down.

Please don't put your branch bundles in the street. Place them in the parkway closest to the curb or the edge of the road. Also, we may not be able to pick them up if a parked car is in the way.

This township service is offered only to residences along the roads that we maintain in unincorporated Lisle Township. Please call if you are unsure if we service your road.


Lisle Township Events

The township roads that will be resurfaced this season are listed below. Approximately 2 inches of surface is removed and replaced with new asphalt.

Project start dates have not yet been determined.

FLYERS will be distributed to the homes along these streets about 5 days before construction begins. They will explain the repair process and outline any driving and parking restrictions.

We apply surface treatments to preserve and restore other township roads.

Reclamite is a sealant used on one year old roads and is reapplied every 4 years. About 14 of our roads are on this schedule.

Crack-filling seals cracks too big for the other products to repair. Contractors clean out the cracks then fill them.


OUR reclamite contractor will

seal one side of the street at a time, so at least one lane is open for resident traffic. The sealants need up to four hours of drying time before the lane is opened.

RESIDENTS living on streets where this work will be done will be notified by flyer before the work starts.

OUR goal is to provide safe, durable and attractive roads and right-of-ways, while minimizing inconvenience to residents.

Letter from Commissioner Ed Young to Township Residents



This past winter wasn't as severe as some in the past but the week of February 4th was tiresome. The crew was out every day. Starting Sunday, February 4th and ending Sunday, February 11th, the crew averaged 84 work hours, most of the time spent in the truck plowing and salting. I thank the Road District crew for their efforts and dedication to our Township. Also, we added a new staff member, Andrew Bark, who has demonstrated a strong work ethic and commitment to Lisle Township.

We are experiencing more cut-through traffic speeding complaints in many of our neighborhoods. Our tools to address this issue are limited and several of our residents have requested additional measures be employed to tackle the problem. We are contacting nearby municipalities to review their efforts and will be examining other measures to see if we can institute additional long-term effective methods. If you have any suggestions, please contact me at the Road District.

Regarding the consolidation of the Lisle and Naperville Township Road Districts, Naperville Township held a special meeting in December 2017 to "Approve a Resolution for a 2018 General Primary Election Referendum to Consolidate the Naperville Township Road District into the Naperville Township". The resolution was tabled to a later date. It is unclear what, if any, such an action would have on the consolidation approved by the voters of both Townships at the last election. Lisle Township Road District has reached out to Naperville Township Road District to begin discussions on the consolidation but has not received a positive response to date. We will continue to reach out to begin discussions on this very important topic.

SIDEWALK SQUARES REPLACEMENT

Deadline is August 1

To help homeowners replace cracked, raised or sunken sidewalks, Lisle Township Road District will pick up half the cost when we fix the squares. **Call our office by August 1 to be put on the sidewalk replacement.** Your cost is \$2.50 per sq. ft., which is \$62.50 for the typical 5' by 5' section.

Leave your name, address and phone number, and put a dab of paint on the squares you want replaced. Our superintendent will measure and give you an agreement form to sign. Return the form with payment of half of your cost. When the job is completed and the area restored (by us), we will bill you for the balance. If the replacement is extensive, you can ask for a payment plan to spread the cost over time.
